



Amy Audibert, Sportsnet, Courtside Reporter, Toronto Raptors

Amy Audibert joined Sportsnet for the 2021-22 NBA season as a courtside reporter for national Raptors on Sportsnet broadcasts.

Prior to her role with

Sportsnet, Audibert served as a TV analyst for Raptors 905 and regularly contributed to Toronto Raptors radio broadcasts as analyst – making history as the first woman to do so in the process! Audibert continued to make broadcast history in 2021 when she served as studio analyst for the first all-female broadcast crew to call an NBA game.

In addition to her work within the NBA, Audibert provided radio analysis for women's basketball during the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games and worked two seasons with the Canadian Elite Basketball League as the courtside reporter. In 2019, Audibert served as TV analyst for the WNBA's Atlanta Dream on several national platforms, including CBS Sports, NBA TV and ESPN+. Prior to that role, Audibert provided colour commentary for The State of New York University at Buffalo's men's and women's basketball teams for six seasons while simultaneously working as a sideline reporter for Time Warner Cable Sports Channel (now Spectrum Sports) for a variety of sports/leagues across Western New York.

In 2018, Audibert assumed the role of analyst and reporter for the Men's U18 FIBA Americas qualifying tournament in St. Catharines, ON. Her works on the 12-game competition was highlighted by a gold medal game



showdown between Canada and the United States.

Prior to her work in sports media, Audibert was a celebrated basketball player at the University of Miami. During her senior season for the Hurricane's, Audibert was named team captain and received the Coaches Award while earning a spot on the All-ACC Academic Women's Basketball Team. She was also recognized for her passion to connect with others and was honoured with the Hurricanes Community Service award for two consecutive years.
